If you feel that he has lived up to the principles of the Scout Oath and Law in his daily living, this should be a part of your recommendation.

We would like for you to write also more specifically of his association with the church. If you feel that there are areas in which he needs development or improvement, this should be stated.

We would appreciate it if you would put your reply in the form of a letter addressed to the Board of Review. The following questions should be answered as you write this recommendation.

- Is he a member of your church?
- Is he regular in his church attendance?
- Does he participate actively in the young people's program of your church? Has he been a leader in such activities?
- Is he active in the Sunday School? Has he ever served as a teacher or an assistant?
- In his association with other young people, does he stand up for what he believes is right?
- Does he set a good example for younger boys to follow?

Your reply will be given careful consideration at his Eagle Interview, which will be held upon receipt of your reply along with others who were given as references.

Your suggestions and recommendations concerning this Scout will be appreciated. Please send your letter to the Unit Committee Chairman, in the stamped, addressed envelope supplied by the Eagle applicant.
