We would like to know if you feel that he has lived up to the principles of the Scout Oath and Law. We would particularly like your appraisal of this in any area in which you have had a chance to observe this boy.

We would appreciate it if you would put your reply in the form of a letter addressed to the Board of Review. The following questions should be answered as you write this recommendation.

- Is he dependable? Does he carry through with his responsibilities, or with what he says he will do?
- Is he helpful to other people? What is his attitude toward older people? How does he get along with those of his own age?
- Is he neat in appearance? What is his attitude toward those in authority? Is he cooperative? Does he set a good example at work? Does he use good sense, and is he courteous?
- Does he respect the property of his employer and others? Is he a good "team" worker?
- Is he cheerful? Is he the kind of a person you like to have around?

Your reply will be given careful consideration in his Eagle Interview, which will be held upon receipt of your reply, along with statements from others who were given as references.
